

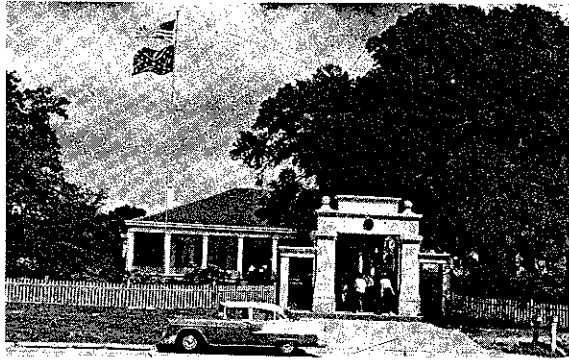

Our records indicate one H.A.Cole entered Jefferson Davis Soldier's Home Feb. 3rd, 1914, age 68 and later given an honorable discharge. He entered from Carroll County, Mississippi and belonged to Co. "A" 30th Mississippi Infantry. On June 13th 1920 he reentered the Home and was again given an honorable discharge on July 7th, 1920. On May 22, 1922 he again entered the Home and died here on August 27th 1923.

CARROLLTON, Miss., Aug. 20.—Henry A. Cole, a veteran of the army of the Confederacy, died early Monday morning at the Soldiers' Home at Beauvoir, Miss., age 78. By wish of his children, his remains were interred to rest among his comrades in the resting place of the heroes there. He was a native of this county, having been reared just west of Black Hawk near the south boundary of the county. Too young for military service at the outbreak of the Civil War, he later, when but a mere boy, enlisted into the service of the Confederacy. During those hard contested and bloody operations about Chattanooga, he with others of a small command of Confederates, was, after a brief and sanguinary battle, captured by an overwhelming force of Federals. Carried north, he endured and survived all the horrors of a Federal prison, until exchanged just a brief time before the close of the conflict. He had been a member of the Methodist Church since early manhood. For several years just prior to entering the Soldiers' Home, he had lived with relatives here. He liked his life at the home, seeming to find it to be a home, indeed. He is survived by one sister, Mrs. Fannie Purcell of Louisville, and four children, Mrs. Emma Keel of this town, Mrs. Mamie Evans and N. E. Cole of Minter City, Miss., and H. E. Cole of Greenwood, Miss.

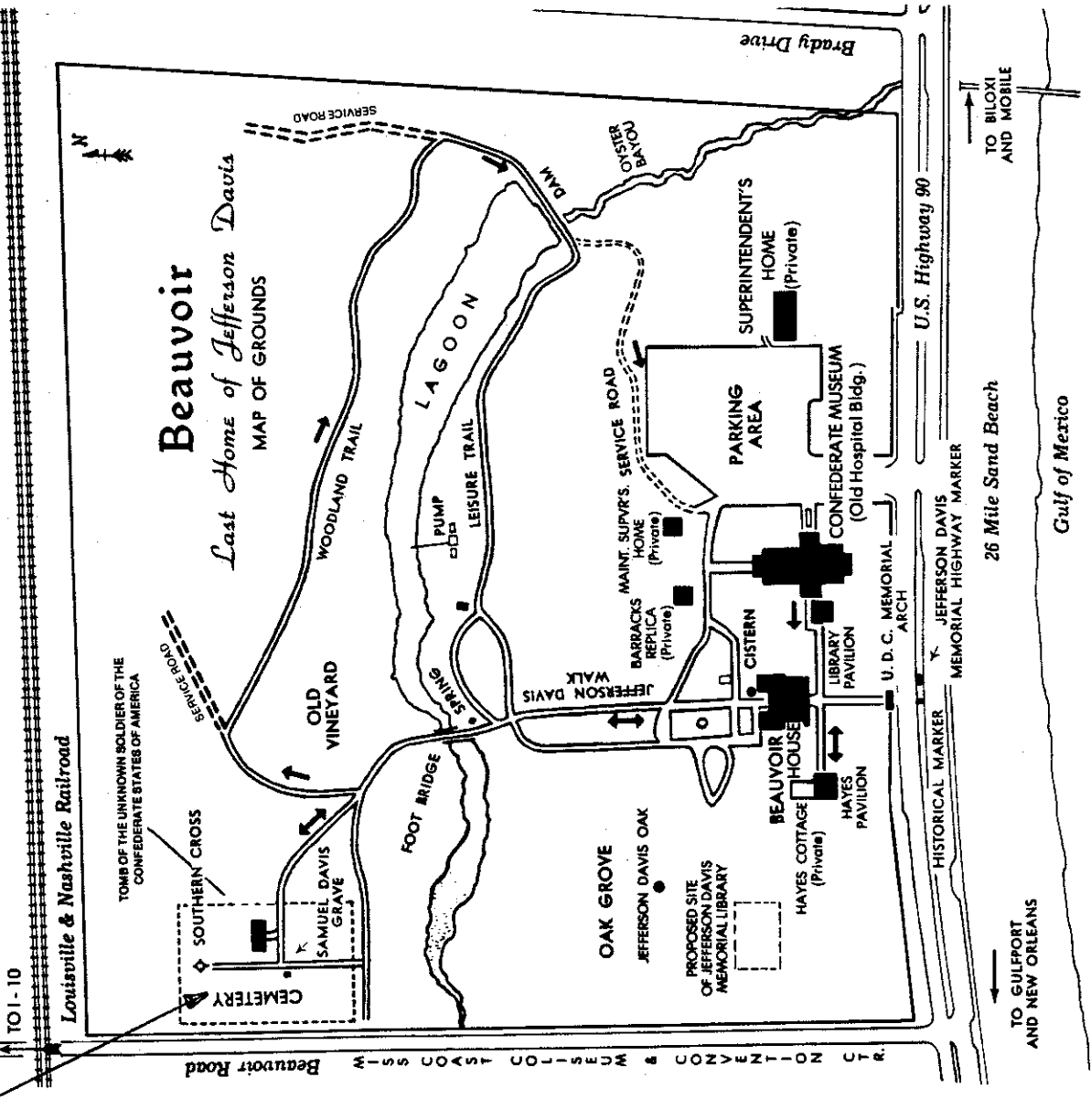
